To improve national security, the Canada Border Service Agency (CBSA) requires electronic Advance Commercial Information (ACI) as of December 2005. Airlines have to provide Canadian Customs with complete and accurate air freight information at least four hours before freight arrival. TRAXON helps you to meet the demands in an efficient and cost-effective way by using the Value Added Service Canada Customs ACI. It guarantees secure communication, between airlines and Canadian Customs authority as well as between forwarding agents and airlines, so that the new regulations can be fulfilled on time and in a reliable manner.

ACI – New regulation for quick Customs decisions in Canada

ACI (Advance Commercial Information) allows Canadian authority to identify in advance whether incoming air freight is a potential risk. The provision of rapid and complete freight information is therefore critical for smooth and speedy Customs decisions.

The new regulations require that freight information be submitted to the Customs office four hours before the freight arrives at the first airport of arrival in Canada. For flights of less than four hours, the information must be submitted before “wheels up”.

Package A: Communication between airlines and Canadian Customs

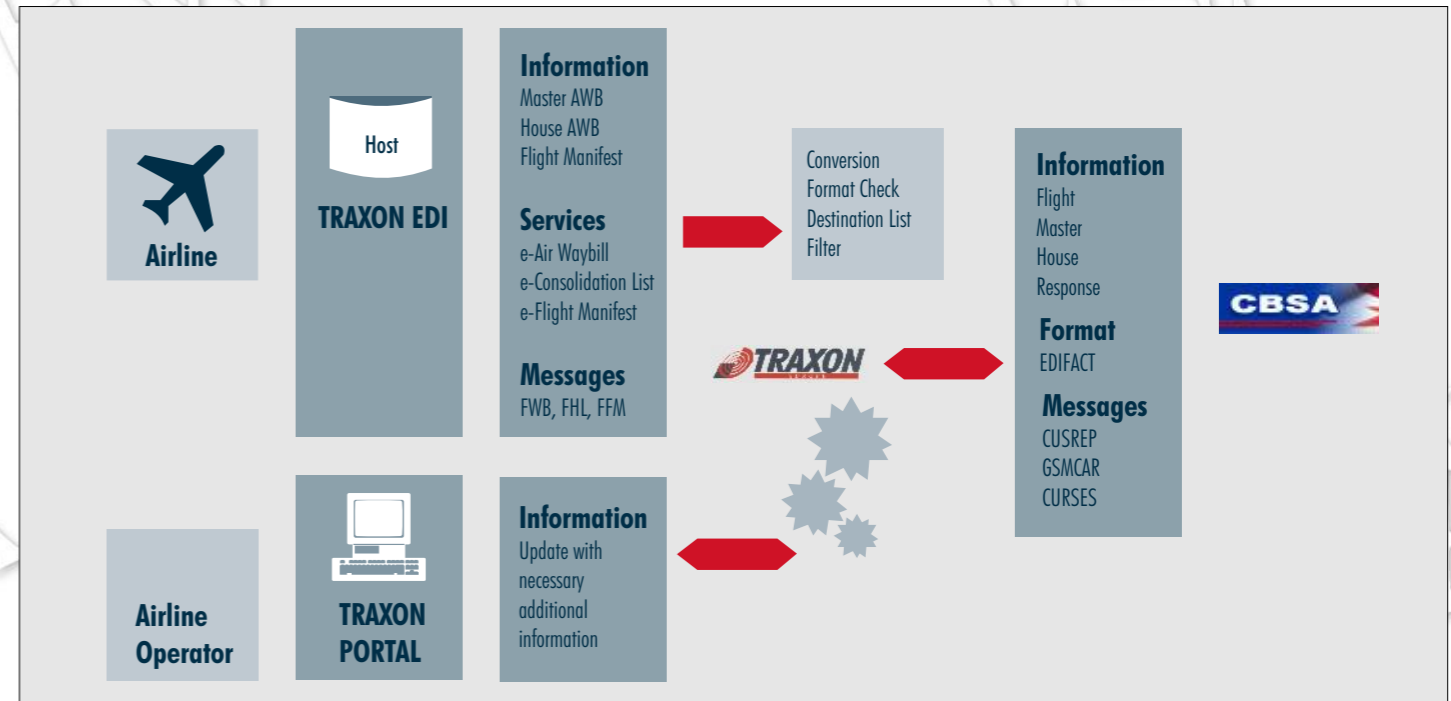
TRAXON PORTAL Canada Customs Module

With TRAXON PORTAL Canada Customs Module, complete Customs declarations guaranteed to meet all the necessary requirements can be sent by the airline to Canadian Customs. The application is web-based and very user-friendly (hosted by TRAXON).

- Airlines send their Master Airway Bill, Consolidation List and Flight Manifest to TRAXON.

- Airlines can complete their freight data effortlessly with additional data required by Customs via the Canada Customs Module of the TRAXON PORTAL.
- TRAXON forwards the complete freight data to the CBSA on operator request.
- The airline receives CBSA responses via TRAXON.
- Sending standard messages airlines do not need to adapt their system to specific Customs requirements.

- After manual completion by the airline, TRAXON sends data in the requested format to Customs.
- If EDI messaging not yet available, TRAXON PORTAL can be used by itself.



Package B: Communication between airlines and Canadian Customs

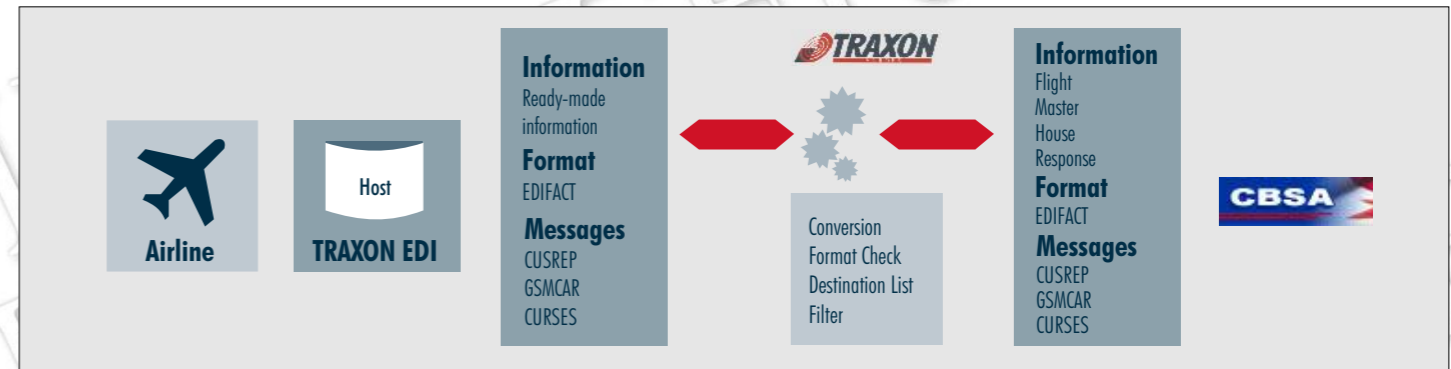
Transmission of Ready-made messages

The airline provides ready-made messages that are sent to Canadian Customs by TRAXON.

The airline uses TRAXON as a gateway to the Canadian Customs system.

- Exchange of airline data already in the required EDIFACT format.
- Communication between airline and Customs via TRAXON EDI (host to host communication channel).

- Airlines do not need to connect to Canada Customs system. Their single interface to TRAXON gives access to Customs worldwide.



Package C: Communication between forwarding agents and airlines

Transmission of electronic master air waybills and house air waybills

The forwarding agent transmits the necessary information to the airlines linked with TRAXON. This package can be selected together with Package A or B.

Forwarding agents can send master air waybills (MAWB) and house air waybills

- (HAWB) to the airlines for shipments to or via Canada
- Using the services e-Air Waybill and e-Consolidation List.
- Airlines receiving this information can update their in-house-system and send

- required information to Canada Customs (Package A or B).
- Airlines reduce manual entry to a minimum.
- Speeds up process and reduces errors.
